This holy task was undertaken on Sunday December 17, 1967. In placing this document in the cornerstone of our new church, we pray Jod that this Holy Temple may ever serve to the Glory of His Holy Name, to the Salvation of the Christian Serbian Orthodox souls. and to the General Welfare of the city of San Diego, through those who worship here Imen.













HISTORY OF THE SAN DIEGO SERBIAN ORTHODOX CHURCH

Seventeen years of hard work and unfaltering faith have brought us to this happy day of dedication.

After World War II the population of the city of San Diego increased at a rapid rate, and the Serbian colony in this area experienced a smiliar growth. With God's help and the strong will of the members of this colony, our parish was founded on May 4, 1952. Through the efforts of the Reverend Harold Robinson of St. Paul's Episcopal Chruch, the congregation of the new St. George Serbian Orthodox Church found a temporary home in the auditorium of St. Paul's Church.

Then, on October 16, 1953, we purchased a building site at 3265 Lincoln Avenue in San Diego. This site was consecrated on October 29, 1954. Groundbreaking for the sanctuary and hall took place on April 1, 1956, and dedication ceremonies were held on November 18 of the same year.





March of 1964 to serve a parish in Pennsylvania, he was succeeded by Father Velimir Petakovich, a youthful and dynamic priest whose dedication and artistic perception have been an inspiration to all of us.

The Department of Highways of the State of California purchased our Lincoln Street property on 1962, thus giving us the opportunity to construct a new and beautiful Serbian Orthodox Church in the great tradition of Byzantine architecture.

On the recommendation of a Building Committee appointed by the congregation, we acquired a two and a half acre parcel of land in the Clairemont-Morena



ceremonies at which Bishop Gregory of the American Western Diocese officiated. (Our church first came under the jurisdiction of that diocese on May 10, 1963, through a broad reorganization of the Serbian Orthodox Church in the United States and Canada.)

In 1960 Father Mladen Trbuhovich assumed the duties of our parish priest. This role he fulfilled for four spiritually rewarding years. When Father Trbuhovich left San Diego in area. The committee then engaged a local architect, George Lykos, to design the new church sanctuary and hall. Construction of the social hall began on May 22, 1966, with groundbreaking

Final services at our Lincoln Avenue location were held June 5, 1966, marking the closing of one era in the history of our parish and the beginning of a glorious new one, which held much promise.

Services were conducted in a rented auditorium until the social hall was ready for occupancy. The first service in the new hall overlooking Mission Bay was held on December 11, 1966, with the Sunday School

president of St. George's parish, and Mr. Milivoj Vuksanovic, also a past president.

The building committee immediately proceeded with plans for a new parish home and a church sanctuary. On December 17, 1967, Bishop Gregory officiated at the consecration of the church grounds, and construction of the church commenced thereafter. On March 16, 1969, the parish home was blessed by His Grace

Originally Mr. Cukich was to paint frescoes in the style of 13th and 14th Century Byzantine art. However, a visit by Mr. Giovanni Maria Nastrucci, general director of a large mosaic manufacturing company in Mexico, resulted in a change of plan. Father Petakovich, the artist, the architect and the building committee conferred and decided to take advantage of Mr. Nastrucci's offer to manufacture mosaics especially for our church. The artist is

February 18, 1967 marked the official dedication of the social hall, with many friends from throughout California attending this historic event. Kums for the occasion were Mr. Andrew Todorica, the first

Church.






Construction of the Church Dome
